- Certified translations are required for documents that are not in English or Malay Language by authorized translators.
- All submitted documents must be within their period of validity at the time of application submission.

English Language Requirements

A MINIMUM SCORE

- Band 5.5 for the International English Language Testing System (IELTS)
 (Academic); OR
- 550 for Paper-based Test (PBT), a score of 213 for Computer- Based Test (CBT) or a score of 80 for Internet-based Test (IBT) for the Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL); OR
- A score which according to the programme standard respectively if it is **higher** than the score set for IELTS (Academic) or TOEFL.
- For any programmes standard which states that TOEFL or IELTS (Academic) score to be lower than what had been constituted by the university, these programmes have to follow the minimum score set by the university
- A score of **Band 4 and above** in the Malaysian University English Test (MUET); OR
- A score of 42 and above in the Pearson Test of Academic English (PTE Academic); OR
- A Grade C and above in English for Advance Level;
 OR
- A Grade C and above in the Cambridge Assessment English: First (FCE); OR
- A Grade C and above in the Cambridge Assessment English: Advanced (CAE); OR
- A Grade C and above in the Cambridge Assessment English: Proficiency (CPE)
