REQUIREMENTS

General Entry

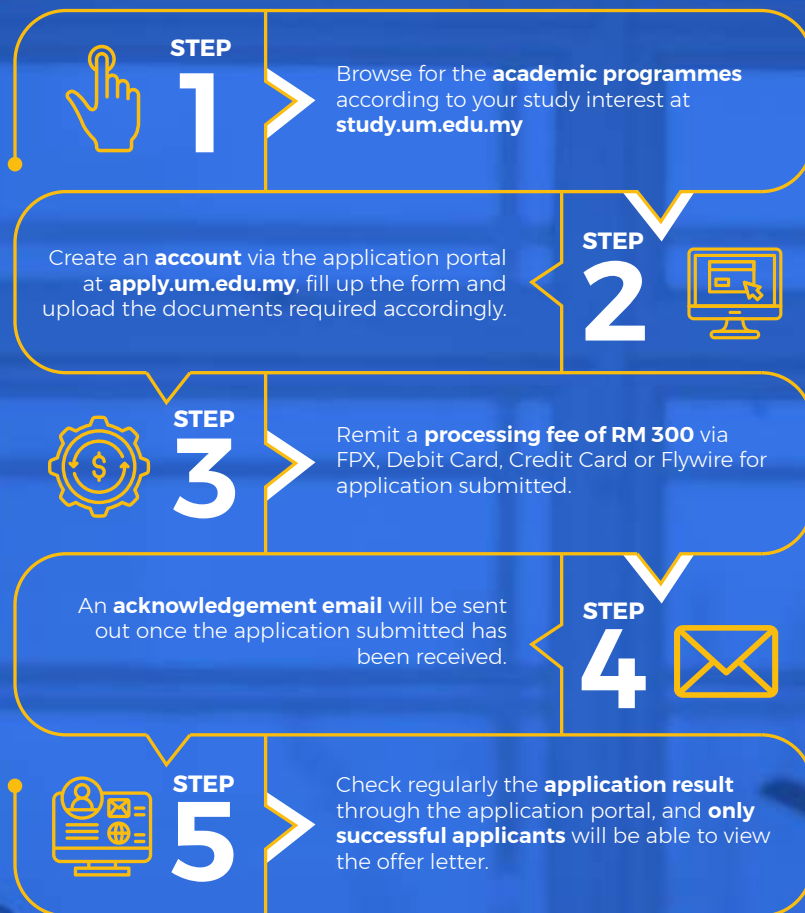
- Completed and passed a minimum of twelve (12) years of study and obtained the following qualifications:
 - (a) National High School Certificate/Grade 12/A-Level/IB/Equivalent; or
 - (b) Possess a Diploma that is recognised by the University with at least a CGPA of 3.00;
- Advanced Subsidiary/ Predicted/ Provisional/ Mock/ Expected result are not acceptable.
- Applicants may be required to undergo an interview and/or test for certain programmes before being accepted by the respective faculty.
- Prospective students may check specific requirements for each programme at **study.um.edu.my**

English Language

- (i) A score of 500 (PBT), 173 (CBT) or 60 (IBT) in Test of English as a Foreign Language (TOEFL); or
- (ii) Band 5.0 and above for International English Language Testing System (IELTS) (Academic); or
- (iii) Band 3 and above in the Malaysian University English Test (MUET); or
- (iv) A score of 41 and above in the Pearson Test of Academic English (PTE Academic); or
- (v) Grade C and above for the English Language subject for the General Certificate of Education (A-Level), University of Cambridge; or
- (vi) Grade C and above for the English Language subject for the General Certificate of Secondary Education (O-Level), University of Cambridge; or
- (vii) Grade C and above in the Cambridge Assessment English: First (FCE); or
- (viii) A score according to the programme standard of the Malaysian Qualifications Agency (MQA) respectively if the requirement is higher than (i) until (vii);**

APPLICATION PROCEDURES



Documents Required

1. A **passport-size photo** with **blue** background.
2. A **passport copy** of the **first page** only.
3. An **Academic Transcript & Certificate**.
4. An **English Language Proficiency Certificate**.
5. **Work evidence, research experience, sponsorship/scholarship letter, support letter** or **professional qualification** (if applicable).

Note:

- An application submitted **will not be processed** without **required documents** and **remittance of processing fee**.
- All payments **shall not involve any transfer of cash** and only **made via payment platform** mentioned.
- Processing fee remitted is **non-refundable**.
- The documents required must be **certified by your previous school** or **respective embassy**.
- **Official translation** is required for documents that are not in **English** or **Malay languages**.

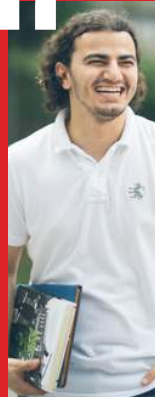

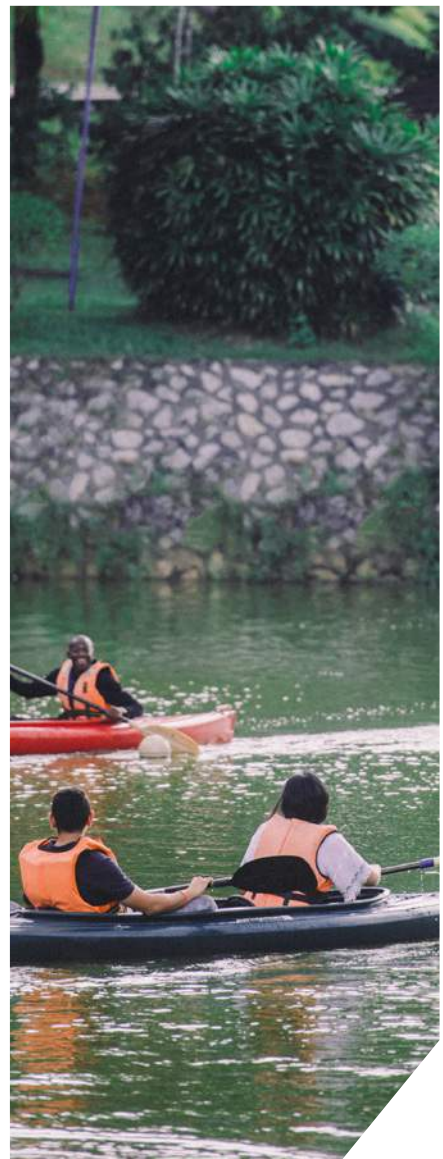
On-Campus Shuttle Service


